Presentation by United Utilities on the new pipe line:

Mainly summer working on land but winter working on roads. Aim is to reseed 75% in the same year as the work. Work should start in March 2017. There will be a Community Benefit Fund but benefit fund, which will be administered by the LDNPA. As yet the total amount available has not been agreed. There will be regular meetings when work starts in the Parish. Local contractors will be used as often as possible. Traffic management will be to aim for as little disruption as possible. The parish council requested regular meetings starting prior to work starting in the parish

- a) <u>Police Matters</u>: Apologies received.
- b) <u>Highways Issues</u>: The Clerk reported that emails were going unanswered. There was a need to have the gulleys cleaned regularly as this contributed to flooding. Local people had cleaned some gulleys in the centre of Blindcrake. The slits into the ditches had been opened up but the soil has left in heaps. No news on the "N HGV" sign for the back lonning. The repairs marked in Blindcrake for March 2015 had not been completed.

- d) <u>Broadband:</u> Andy Prickett reported on the current situation. The contract for completion of Phase 1 has been extended. Blindcrake and Redmain would get Fibre link from the exchange. It seems as if Sunderland and Isel are not included in Phase 2. A meeting with Connection Cumbria would be requested.
- e) Overhead electric cables: No further news.
- f) <u>The Green Drainage</u>: The Children's Committee were looking at developing a play area. Andy Prickett and Rachel Gerrard would look at the drainage of the green.
